Student Survey Results on LE Period

Thank you for filling out the survey on LE period. Your input is valuable to our school. Here are the results:

- **"LE Early" Option** was the first choice of 41% of students and the second choice of 22% of students.
- **"LE Late" Option** was the first choice of 40% of the students and the second choice of 49% of students.
- **"LE Early for first 3 weeks of quarter, then Late for Rest" Option** was the first choice of 11% of students and the second choice of 26% of students.
- **"No LE period"** was the first choice of 8% of students and the second choice of 3% of students.

The results clearly show that almost everyone wants to keep LE period, but we are evenly divided whether to have it early or late. More students did choose the "LE Late" option as their second choice, which means that there are more students strongly opposed to "LE Early" than "LE Late." **We will have "LE Late" for the rest of this quarter.**
