Our annual Career Day is coming soon on Friday, March 2, 2018. Here are 3 tips on ways to investigate future careers:

- 1) Identify your strengths. Ask yourself questions (“What am I good at that I also enjoy?”) and write down your answers (math). Then, you can use this information to find careers that match (accountant, statistician). Bonus: This will sharpen your critical-thinking abilities.
